2023 PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

I am pleased to present to the St Francis Xavier's Catholic School community an overview of the 2023 school year. Whilst all schools are busy places, with lots of things happening, 2023 was a year that provided an opportunity to look back and reflect upon our past, as well as celebrate the present and look forward to the future.

40th Anniversary Year

2023 was the 40th Anniversary of St Francis Xavier's Catholic School, officially opening its doors to the local community in 1983. We celebrated in fine style with several events organised for the school community, including:

- Whole school concert at Influencers Church. The theme was "A Journey through the Decades".
- A Community Dinner was held at the Marche Club with Past Principals, Staff, Mr Blair Boyer MP, Mr Tony Zappia MP and Fr Kym Spurling in attendance as well as past and current families from across the school community.
- Sports Day at Bridgestone Arena
- St Francis Xavier's Feast Day Mass, where we celebrated 40 years, including a cake and muffins
 for students and staff. We also had a fun day with a Jumping Castle and Rock Climbing Wall for the
 children.

Wright Volunteer Award 2023

Matthew and Jo Burns became part of the SFX community in 2011 with their first-born Sienna commencing at SFX. Right from the beginning, they became invested as part of our SFX family through volunteering in many forms. It started with reading and excursions and then continued to grow as their children grew at SFX.

As their girls progressed through the years, Jo and Matt's involvement increased at SFX with volunteering for the numerous SAPSASA and Catholic Sporting events that the girls were selected in, including – Netball, Softball, Athletics, Girls Football, Soccer, and Cheer Competitions. Their involvement ranged from assisting on the day to coaching teams and taking on marshalling roles. Over the years, Jo has also been the 'unofficial SFX photographer' for all our community events – Music Concerts, Sports Days, Mad March Fairs, School Masses, Colour Fun Runs and the list goes on.

Both Matt and Jo have also coached After-School sports teams.

Their involvement has even reached our local SAPSASA TTG District events with coaching, assistant coaching,

and marshalling (and photography) for TTG District Representative teams.

Molly- Well-being dog

In September 2023, we introduced our new well-being dog (Molly) to SFX. We have worked in partnership with Dogs Connect to be accredited and ensure Molly had a smooth transition to our school. We undertook weekly meetings, completed the online Dogs Connect units and met with the Dogs Connect team to be assessed on each unit. Molly also had extensive 1-1 training with Paws Adventure to ensure she was ready to work at our school and continues to complete ongoing training.

Evidence shows that just being near a dog when stressed can reduce anxiety. In one of our surveys, 92% of students said they felt more relaxed during teaching and learning time when a dog was in the classroom. We all know when children are more relaxed and less stressed, they're going to learn more.

Having a school dog can also help with:

School attendance

Students experience a greater willingness to be active in the school environment when there is a school dog. School attendance rates improved as children looked forward to seeing a dog and interacting with them.

Communication

A dog in school gives students a shared interest with other members of the school community. This helps them interact and build connections that they may have struggled to do otherwise. Well-being dogs can even be used with literacy programs as children may be less self-conscious reading to dogs than teachers or their peers.

Leadership

A school dog can give students a sense of responsibility. They learn how to take care of the dog and how to delegate care, which can help them grow their leadership skills.

Behaviour

Students can see the impact of their actions on their well-being dog. This helps them understand how their behaviour impacts people around them. As a result, children learn to be more empathetic and understanding.

• Students dealing with trauma

We focus on bringing connectedness and finding ways to manage trauma and anxiety in conjunction with existing strategies and community links. A well-being dog provides a calming presence when students are heightened or anxious and can help to regulate their behaviour and emotions.

Molly has been an amazing asset to our school. We continue working With Dogs Connect and Paws Adventure to ensure we provide Molly and the children with the best experience possible of having a dog on site to assist the children and staff.

Children's University

Last year, we participated in the University of Adelaide's Children's University for the first time. Children's University offers opportunities and recognises children's efforts to participate in and complete beyond-school learning. Our hope is that this encourages a love of learning in their pursuit of a future career. Children and young people can only aspire to what they know exists, and Children's University provides them with a system to navigate potential future pathways through this learning.

Children's University facilitates superior educational experiences for students outside of school hours and recognises their achievements through a graduation ceremony with certificates. This is done by leveraging local educational activity providers such as museums, theatres, school clubs and sports groups.

Learning Walks and Talks

We commenced Learning Walks last year through the classrooms and asked the children the following five questions.

- 1. What are you learning?
- 2. How are you going?
- 3. How do you know?
- 4. How can you improve?
- 5. Where can you go for help?

New staff and Departing staff

In 2023 we employed 12 new staff. Anita Avolio, Caitlin Costello, Malissa Jones, Ashlee McCarthy, Meaghan McCarthy, Leila Magnus, James Nisbet, James Norton, Michael O'Connell, Tayla Skurray, Victoria Szilassy, and Anne-Marie Wesley.

Enrolments

We commenced 2023 with 474 students and ended up with 528. We had two transition classes commence in Term 3. Curious Xavier's and Playgroup were again very popular, and our numbers are




2023 FINANCE REPORT

Staff Attendance


Teaching staff attendance for the 2023 school year was 93%, and the types of leave taken include sick leave, family leave, carers leave and bereavement leave.

Staff Retention

In 2023, 95% of our teachers continued from the previous year.

Staff Qualifications

We are very fortunate to have many staff with two or more qualifications in education. Among our staff there are 44 Bachelor degrees, 15 Certificates, 8 Diplomas, 9 Graduate Certificates, 5 Masters Degrees and 3 Graduate Diplomas totaling 84 in all.

School Funding


As a Catholic School we rely on the prompt payment of school fees to assist with the operation of the school.

2023 Information Communication Technologies (ICT)

During 2023 the School Leadership team in conjunction with the School Finance and ICT teams and with input from teaching and educator staff, worked together to ensure that the technologies available at SFX would meet the needs of all members of the school community, including students and all staff (teaching, support and admin). The information below provides a summary of the tasks undertaken:

- Maintenance of the ICT renewal program. This will ensure that ICTs are routinely updated to meet the changing technological landscape and that replacement costs are appropriately staggered over three or four years (depending on items).
- Rollout of new Laptop devices for all students in Year 3 and Year 4.
- Rollout of new iPad banks and docking stations for classes in Reception to Year 2.
- Rollout of new Desktop computers for administrative staff.
- Creating a bank of previously used laptop devices and repurposing them for students in the Ignatius Building (Years 1 & 2).
- Purchase of charging stations to facilitate the increase in devices.
- Changeover of the SFX Student Reporting system from Accelerus to SEQTA in line with CESA guidelines.
- Purchase and installation of SMART Panels for all classes from Reception - Year 2, plus Specialist Teacher rooms (Music & Languages)
- Ordering of SMART Boards for Year 3-6 Classrooms in preparation for the 2024 School Year
- Ordering of RedCat Soundfields for all Classrooms (R-6) in preparation for the 2024 School Year.
- Purchase or renewal of online subscriptions for student administration, reporting, curriculum and well-being.
- Development of a Mobile Phone and Wearable Devices policy and an updated ICT Acceptable Use Agreement for students in Year 3-6 in preparation for the 2024 School Year.
- Increase in ICT onsite support staff from 3 to 4.5 days per week, including dedicated CESA ICT technicians.
